Students immersed themselves in a Mock Election, learning key democratic principles. Students formed political parties, spoke on varying government issues, and performed speeches to accompany their campaign.





Students have been working hard to help create school spirit, with things like Spirit Week, decorating, and more! They're looking forward to the next spirit events,




