Dual Credit


Grade 11 students now have the opportunity to apply to engage in Dual Credit academic (University Transfer) courses next year at NLC. Students can apply for up to 3 courses and should see Mrs. Hoecherl as soon as possible in the NPSS Dual Credit Office if they would like to do so. If they are interested in taking a trade or a certificate program these are filing quickly, but still available. Again, stop and see Mrs. Hoecherl (Dual Credit Coordinator) ASAP.

Work Experience and Youth Work in Trades (Apprenticeship)

Students currently working could be engaging in Work Experience or Youth Work in Trades and earning credits at school for the learning they are experiencing in the workplace. Students interested in signing up should connect with Mr. Mayer or Mr. Vaccaro.

CREATING ENERGY CAREERS

Creating Energy Careers ran for a second year in a row this February. It's a program developed in partnership with community support to provide new career opportunities for our students wanting to explore careers in the Oil & Gas sector. Career opportunities included CNC drafting, surveying, project management, Health & Safety roles, and administration, as well as some trades: welding, pipefitting, heavy-duty technician, and electrical and instrumentation were offered. Industry partners provided the experience for the students: Rumble, Techmation, Caltech, Roy Northern, Brandt Tractor and McElhanney.



GROWING OUR OWN

Once again, Urban Systems Foundation partnered up with School District 60 to hold their annual Grow Our Own Event at the Lido Theater this March 7. Their 9th event together, 25 professional mentors took time out of their busy schedules to meet some of the 33 students who attended the event. Students sign up for the event, then preselect 5 different mentors that they would like to meet in 5 different 25-minute sessions held throughout the day. Urban Systems Foundation provides lunch for the event. Both students and mentors find the opportunity so valuable as the event resembles a mini career conference with a keynote speaker (a former graduate of NPSS who has gone away for professional training, then come back to work back in their hometown-hence the term "Growing Our Own"). This year's keynote, Sarah Cowger, gave students 10 thinking points of advice about the benefits of going away, then coming back to work in her hometown.
